

Middle Grade Book Studies Group The Story of The House on Mango Street




The Middle Grades group engaged in a close reading of Sandra Cisneros' widely acclaimed book, *The House on Mango Street*.

We researched about the author and wrote our own Orikis to describe ourselves. Oriki is form of "praise poetry" used by the Yoruba speakers of West Africa. It's a personal hype story, if you will, where bragging is absolutely essential.

We dug into *The House on Mango Street* and discussed the themes that resonated with us including: community, home, age, and belonging. We also discussed our favorite vignettes (chapters) and the various literary functions that Cisneros uses to make the community and the characters come alive.

Staying close to her style of writing, we decided to write our own vignettes to share a bit about our neighborhoods, communities and loved ones.

The next day it was stuck in my head.


